Coordinated healthcare closer to home

To help people better manage their health closer to home, a new Healthcare Hubs program is available.

Living with multiple health conditions often means seeing many health professionals in several different locations. This can be difficult to navigate and coordinate for patients.

Taking part in the Healthcare Hubs program ensures health professionals talk to each other and coordinate your care.

Your Healthcare Hub team will include a GP, Nurse Practitioner, allied health professionals, other professionals or specialists usually involved in your care, and you will receive help from a Care Coordinator who will answer your questions, make appointments and organise referrals.

If you'd like to know more about this program and how it could support and benefit you, talk with reception or your GP or Nurse Practitioner.

Please note that some services will incur out-of-pocket expenses.
